

The Thanksgiving

Minister: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Minister: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right for us to give thanks and praise.

Minister: With joy we praise you, gracious God, for you have created heaven and earth, made us in your image, and kept covenant with us-- even when we fell into sin. We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whose grace we may triumph over temptation, be more fervent in prayer, and be more generous in love. Therefore we join our voices with all the saints and angels and the whole creation to proclaim the glory of your name. We thank you for sending your Son to deliver us from the way of sin and death, by his obedient life, by his suffering and death upon the cross, and by his resurrection from the dead. All our hope is in him, and so we sing his praise

The Institution

- Minister: We give thanks to God the Father that our Savior, Jesus Christ, before he suffered, gave us this memorial of his sacrifice, until he comes again. At his last supper, the Lord Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it [here the minister breaks the bread] and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, he took the cup after supper [here the minister pours the wine] and said, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this in remembrance of me." For whenever we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. Therefore, we proclaim our faith as signed and sealed in this sacrament:
- People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Minister: We ought never to treat this gift of grace lightly. Jesus Christ surrendered His life so that our sins might be paid for. He died an agonizing and demeaning death so that we might have salvation. This means that we must examine ourselves to see if we are right with Him. If we have not been following God, if we are knowingly living against His will then this is not a meal that we should partake of this meal because we are then eating and drinking judgment upon ourselves. Yet if we have sin lingering in us that we are truly repentant for then Christ welcomes you to this table as He serves us these gifts of grace.
- Q. What does it mean to eat the crucified body of Christ and to drink his poured-out blood?
- A. It means to accept with a believing heart the entire suffering and death of Christ

and thereby to receive forgiveness of sins and eternal life. But it means more. Through the Holy Spirit, who lives both in Christ and in us, we are united more and more to Christ's blessed body. And so, although he is in heaven and we are on earth, we are flesh of his flesh and bone of his bone. And we forever live on and are governed by one Spirit, as the members of our body are by one soul.

Prayer of Consecration

Minister: Lord, our God, send your Holy Spirit so that this bread and juice may be for us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. May we and all your saints be united with Christ and remain faithful in faith, hope, and love. Gather your whole church, O Lord, into the glory of your kingdom. Kindle the fire of love in our own hearts as it is in Christ's. Inspire us to serve you and one another. We pray in the name of Jesus, who taught us to pray saying,

All: "Our Father who art in heaven...Amen."

The Invitation

Minister: Family of God, the Lord has prepared his table for all who love him and trust in him alone for their salvation. All who are truly sorry for their sins, who sincerely believe in the Lord Jesus as their Savior, and who desire to live in obedience to him as Lord, are now invited to come with gladness to the table of the Lord. The gifts of God for the people of God!

The Communion

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body."

Minister: Take, eat, remember, and believe that the body of our Lord Jesus Christ was given for the complete forgiveness of all our sins.

Then he took the cup, gave thanks and offered it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Song: Let Us Break Bread Together – R460 vs. 2 while the juice is served

Minister: Take, drink, remember, and believe that the blood of our Lord Jesus Christ was given for the complete forgiveness of all our sins.

Praise the Lord, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name. Praise the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits-- who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion.

All: "Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and praise!"



THIS WEEK'S CREATION MOMENT

New Antibiotic Discovered Inside Your Nose!



Beloved, I wish above all things that thou may est prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth. -3 John 1:2

According to researchers from the University of Tübingen and the German Center for Infection Research, a bacterium in your nose may have

already saved your life numerous times in the past and will likely save your life many times more in the future. That bacterium – Staphylococcus lugdunensis – is well known for inhabiting your nose. But now it has come to light that the bacterium produces a previously unknown antibiotic named Lugdunin.

The antibiotic is said to be "able to combat multi-resistant pathogens, where many classic antibiotics have become ineffective." According to the research team, infections caused by Staphylococcus aureus ranks as one of the leading causes of death worldwide. However, the researchers found that this deadly strain of Staph is rarely found when Staphylococcus lugdunensis is present in the nose.

According to Professor Andreas Peschel, "Normally, antibiotics are formed only by soil bacteria and fungi. The notion that human microflora may also be a source of antimicrobial agents is a new discovery." The discovery is good news in itself. Even better, it may open up new ways to develop strategies for infection protection and to find new antibiotics within the human body.

Who could have thought that microscopic bacteria in our noses produced an antibiotic that could protect us from deadly microbes? There's no question in our mind that our Creator thought of it because He cares so much about us!
