Update from Evan Tinklenberg, Geneva Campus

Grace at the beginning

For the last few weeks, much of what I've been teaching and discussing with students has had to do with work and rest. Skimming the past few newsletters, I'm realizing how prevalent that theme has been since the fall. So it's no surprise that I've long been reflecting on the primacy of rest in the Christian life: Sunday is the first day of the week. For the Christian, the week begins with rest. As Pete Scazzero puts it, this reminds us that, before we've done anything to earn it, we're already loved and accepted by God in Christ.

I've been making use of regular student lunches to discuss various spiritual disciplines and as a way of inculcating a practice of rest for the students. For the last student lunch of the semester, we turned our attention to this very idea, reflecting on Sabbath practices the students can take with them during and beyond their university days. We tried to approach the topic with realism, recognizing, as Dan Allender suggests, that "[f]ew people are willing to enter the Sabbath and sanctify it, to make it holy, because a full day of delight and joy is more than most people can bear in a lifetime, let alone a week." Yet it is this reflective and restful practice that brings full energy and meaning to our work.

A Summer Summary

Summer is a unique time for campus ministries. Far fewer students occupy the usual spaces (as evinced by the photo above), leaving the days open for other aspects of the work. In my case, these involve four "s" words: *social*, *strategy*, *sermons*, and *Synod*. In order:

Social Events

I have a few students who will be around Madison this summer, so I'm working on plans for some fun events to do together. Summer in Madison is, as I'm quickly learning, a beautiful time to be outside exploring. I expect to do some kayaking and other outdoor activities with students, fortifying existing relationships and forging new ones along the way.

Strategic Planning

Summer affords a unique opportunity to step back from on-the-ground work and look at what I've accomplished and ahead to what I hope to do. One of my summer goals is to refine my vision of the campus ministry and come up with some concrete plans for the next few years. I'm also looking to critically reflect on the past two semesters and determine what I've learned and how I can grow.

Sermons

I'll be preaching several times this summer, both at Geneva and at churches around Wisconsin. I learned my lesson from March/April, so none of them are so closely clustered together that I am overly busy. Still, I am looking forward to visiting new churches, making new connections across Wisconsin, and further honing my skills as a preacher.

Synod

As a Minister of the Word in the CRCNA, one of the privileges and responsibilities I have is to work for the good of the broader denomination. This year, that means serving as a delegate to Synod, the yearly assembly of representatives from every classis (the local assembly of council representatives, which itself represents each local church). I've got a 600+ page Agenda for Synod to read through, and responsibility on an advisory committee for which I am preparing. It's not light work, but I'm excited to participate in the work of the church in this way.

Prayer Requests

- For the students who are traveling over the summer, whether to other
 parts of Wisconsin or elsewhere in the world. Pray for safe travels, restful
 summers (or productive, if need be), and deepened relationships even
 with those who are not local.
- For the plans I hope to be making over the summer. Pray that I would recognize where I must focus, where I need to say yes or no, and how best to use my abilities and gifts for the sake of the University community. Pray in particular for my increasing involvement with law students, for clarity and focus in that work, and for wisdom as I seek to shepherd those students well.
- For my summer preaching responsibilities. Pray for wholehearted sermons that faithfully expound God's word and lovingly apply it to the people in the room.
- For provision in many ways: relationally, emotionally, spiritually, and financially. Pray for the continued building up of a group of supporters who can pray for this work, and for local relationships that provide encouragement and wisdom where I need it most.
