Welcome to First CRC! We're glad you're here to worship with us today! By God's grace, we're a family of believers that has been gathering to worship God and serve others for some 100 years. We were established out of nearby Alto CRC, in 1921, and later in 1961, Bethel CRC in Waupun, started from members of First.

At First CRC, in Sunday worship and during the week, you'll find many historic and biblical practices of the Christian faith. Our leadership, elders and deacons and pastor, seek to keep these vibrant and relevant to Christians living in today's world.

Child Care and Student Ministries on Sunday Mornings

During worship, we have nursery care for children ages 0-2, and Children's Worship for children ages 3 through 4K. Children's Worship kids are dismissed halfway through the worship service. After worship parents should pick up their children on the upper level where these ministries take place. If you need to take a child out of the worship service for a bit, you may go to our Lower Level where there are two couches and a nearby bathroom. By the couches a TV is playing the service live.

Sunday School and Catechism for K – 12th graders is currently on summer break.

Council Notes—May 7 and 28, 2025, First CRC Council Meetings:

- The Council joyfully heard the professions of faith of Jaxon Buteyn, Ryer Greenfield, Taylor Hoffman and Sophia Schuringa. Three of these students made public profession of Faith on May 25 and were welcomed as members in full standing at First CRC. One student will be making public profession of faith on June 15. There was also a report on another profession of faith class beginning with three other students expected to come before the Council in a few months.
- Pastor Greg led the Council Equipping time with a discussion of two articles on The Mission of the Church in Our Word Belongs to God, our Contemporary Testimony and their implications for our mission and ministry here at First.
- Council reviewed the upcoming worship schedule, including special worship services as well as guest pastors over the summer.
- Pastor Greg's Pastor's report was received and reviewed by the Council.
- The Elders reported on a new endeavor to create congregational "Visiting Care Teams" as a way to give more care and attention to church members who could use extra care. An elder team has begun working on this.
- Deacons and Finance: report of overall healthy giving, though low giving continues toward denominational and classical ministry funds. An increase in budget is expected this coming year for our Covenant Education Program.

- The Discipleship Committee highlighted the upcoming Life Group Olympics, a large annual event for our Life Groups.
- The Outreach Committee reported on preparations for our church Neighborhood Block Party, our largest and best attended outreach event, planned for Saturday, August 23, this year. As always church members and people from the community are welcome to enjoy good food, games and good connections with others.
- The Council also approved a church budget for the 2025-2026 year, to be presented at our Monday, June 16, 6:30 PM meeting. We will also be electing new elders and deacons to serve a three-year term at this meeting. Council was grateful for the nominees accepting their request to be willing to serve in this special way in the church.
