Late Summer Learning – Update from Evan Tinklenberg at Geneva Campus

This is my first summer in campus ministry. As new as I am to all this, I've known that my best source of wisdom comes in the form of experience from other campus ministers. I've gleaned from them that summer just is a strange time for college ministry; regular rhythms are disrupted and it often allows for some time to reflect and prepare for the next ministry year.

I've experienced some of that (including some strategic planning and a broad look at the whole calendar up to next summer), but I've also found much more to do this summer than I anticipated. I've had a few opportunities to preach, and I've enjoyed meeting with students who aren't usually around during the school year. Below I'll write briefly about some of that. There have also been a few book discussions that I've found helpful. In this newsletter, I mostly want to reflect on two of those books, introduce a third, and recommend a few of my recent reads.

Continuing Ministry Preaching

I'm continuing to preach at churches around Classis Wisconsin, and this past Sunday (7/28) I had the privilege of preaching at Christ Community CRC in Sheboygan. As is not



unusual in these visits, the congregation was extraordinarily hospitable, and I'm very thankful for their welcome. It was great as well

to spend time with one of my students who recently graduated and moved to the area. I certainly loved being so near the lake!

Good Connections



I've also been reaching out to students who are in town over the summer, whether they are UW-Madison students or not. It's been a wonderful opportunity to catch people at a (literally) different season, with the stress of the semester and the other burdens that come along with the school year at some remove. It strikes me how, even with much of the student body gone during the summer, it never quite feels empty on campus. There are moments, to be sure, but it is a far cry from the total stillness I experienced in summers during

my undergrad. Even so, that doesn't guarantee lack of loneliness and my hope is that I can help students see that even in times of greater loneliness or listlessness Jesus is still at work in them by his Spirit. It's something I do well to remember as well, that even when things lull rather than buzz, God is not less active (indeed, those quiet moments often afford clearer attention to the multifarious ways in which he's always already at work).

Prayer Requests

- Pray for the students who are here on campus during the remainder of the summer. Pray that they would find ways of belonging, of deepening communion with others and with the Lord.
- Pray also for the upcoming semester: for new students, returning students, for Theology Breakfast, group meetings, Bible studies, and all of the pastoral relationships I hope to build up over the next year.

• Finally, pray for me and my family, that the Lord would provide the energy and strength to endure seasons of intense busyness, the focus and wisdom necessary to attend to what matters most, and the patience and grace to love each other and those around us well.

Glittering Vices by Rebecca Konyndyk-DeYoung

When I realized how many students were staying in Madison over the summer, I knew I wanted to get them together more often. Specifically, I wanted to take advantage of the (potentially) slower pace of summer to dive into something a bit more introspective. That's why I picked Glittering Vices; it's a book that purports to be an interesting exposition of the 'seven deadly sins' but ends up being about spiritual formation and the grace of sanctification. We've been meeting at the Terrace at Memorial Union, which is a lively location for such a discussion!

The first few discussions have been richly stimulating, and have provoked deeper self-reflection and examination of my heart. I've really appreciated the thoughtfulness of the others who've joined along; they've prompted some truly fresh insights and caused me to return again to the text of Scripture and the wisdom God gives in his Son. I'm tempted to do a discussion on this book every year as part of my annual review!

The Trellis and the Vine by Colin Marshall and Tony Payne Our church's leadership is reading this together. I haven't gotten to read much beyond the first few pages, but I've heard many good things about it! The extended metaphor alluded to in the book's title is already a helpful heuristic: administrative functions are helpful only insofar as they enable the spiritual and relational functions of the local church. If they become the primary focus of attention, the real purpose of the church gets neglected. Nevertheless, vines don't grow up on their own! Structures are necessary for the slower work of discipleship to flourish. I'm looking forward to reading more and discussing it!
