Beginning Again with Faith, Hope and Love

Starting year 2 in Campus Ministry
Update from Evan Tinklenberg, Geneva Campus Church

Students are back on campus, and the semester begins a few days after Labor Day. This week marks the beginning of my second year in my role as Campus Pastor at Geneva Campus Church, and I'm excited for what is coming ahead this semester.

Growing in Faith

I'm convinced that robust Christian catechesis is one of the most important things I can do on campus. This means more than teaching on Christian doctrine, of course, but certainly not less. For that reason, I've decided to devote more time and energy to Theology Breakfast, building it up from a monthly 90-minute event to a biweekly 2-hour gathering for prayer, learning, and friendship. Think of it as a crash course in Christian doctrine that aims to knit together head and heart knowledge and kindle a lifelong fidelity to Jesus.

Being ready for this level of intensification is a challenge since I've bound myself to a pattern of deep study on a short timeline. But this is a challenge I aim to meet with enthusiasm and joy. It's a lot of planting and watering, and I'll trust God with the growth. One way I'm handling the increased demand on my time is by sharing the work of prep with others; rather than going to get bagels, coffee, and fruit myself each time, I've enlisted the help of several members of Geneva to provide food. This way, I'll be freed a bit to focus on the lesson and fellowship, and the food will also be way better.

Of all the things going on this year, I'd especially appreciate your prayers for this ministry, in two ways in particular. First, pray for the students who come — for them to invite others and to feel welcome, for them to engage thoughtfully and deeply with Scripture and the Christian tradition's meditations on it, and for them to come away more in awe of God and more wondrously grateful for what he has done in Jesus. Second, pray for me — that I would have the wisdom to focus my study on what is most beneficial for my students, that I would bring clarity and conviction to my teaching, and that I would demonstrate my love for them through hospitality and faithful catechesis.

In addition to Theology Breakfast, I'll also be participating in various Bible studies, both formally organized and ad-hoc, and I would love for this year to be one in which my overall attention to Scripture is deepened and enriched for both my own sake and the students. In other words, I'm praying for greater correspondence between *input* and *output* (a perennial temptation for campus ministers is to let the latter run the show).

Growing in Hope

If all theology is is another academic discipline to which students are encouraged to devote time and energy; if the highest good of such a

discipline is cognitive mastery (or, more commonly, a passing grade); if, in short, theology is reduced to faith's *content* (in the same way social media influencers produce *content*), then it is in vain. What is more, I won't have anyone's attention for very long. That is why I'm marrying theory and practice intentionally this year by centering monthly student lunches (hosted at various Geneva members' homes) on crafting a rule of life.



If my students come away from their time at UW-Madison not having a solid grasp of what Christians believe, that would be a significant disappointment to me. Yet, even more significant would be my disappointment if they don't even know how to *live* like a Christian! A rule of life, then, is one way for them to inhabit the Christian tradition self-consciously, in tangible ways, that will open them up to real flourishing.

The pilgrimage that such self-conscious habitation sets you on isn't an individual affair, however. It puts you in the path of other people quite intentionally and regularly. To foster a culture of vulnerability and genuine community, I'm making myself available for "office hours" at regular intervals throughout the week. It's a time for students to run into me on accident or on purpose, to bring up weighty things they need pastoral guidance on — or just chat about whatever they would like. In doing this, I aim to reinforce that they never have to walk the pilgrimage of faith alone. They are of course finally responsible for their own faithfulness, but they are invited always to share that burden with those around them.

Pray for students to feel free enough to open up, both at office hours and at student lunches, and not just opened up to me or other Christians, but to God and his Spirit at work in them. Pray for these moments to be particularly available for the Spirit's gifts, and for the students to be receptive to them.

Growing in Love

All this is directed to what Jesus calls the greatest commandment: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength...[and] love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:30-31). Faith and Hope have their place, but their ultimate End (*telos*) is Love.
