Sermon Notes

Update from New Life Church in Tyachiv, Ukraine

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Greetings from Tyachiv, Ukraine. It has now been 90 days since Russia first invaded Ukraine on February 24th. What an experience we've had these past three months! What started out as shock and chaos, working non-stop with refugees fleeing, has in time, led to order, balance and teamwork, as we work together, as a church and with the refugees. We can now see that we are in a period of blessing, despite the war, as we are growing and seeking together God's Kingdom. We are seeking the Lord together every morning through prayer and petition. We are seeking to further God's Kingdom together, using street evangelism, Bible studies for adults, teens, youth and even toddlers. Despite the fact that we were all strangers (our small church and all the refugees) a few months ago, we now enjoy love and fellowship through the Holy Spirit. We are thankful for all the Lord has been teaching us these past months.

New Life church continues to feed about 150 refugees each day. As God enables, we continue to send help to Christians in Karkiv and other hard hit cities. The Lord has been so faithful in taking care of His Church here. Praise God! Right now we are trying to prepare for the food shortages and possible coming famine. We, as a church have planted a field of potatoes, and everyone that has the opportunity, has planted gardens. We are also raising ducks and chickens for eggs and meat.

We ask for your continued support through prayer. Please pray for God to bless our crops and gardens with much needed rain. Please pray for wisdom for us, as we learn how to live in these difficult times. Although we are sure of God's goodness and faithfulness, we also need wisdom in how to help with all the various needs we meet daily. It is very difficult to buy gasoline and diesel. Last week, I traveled to Romania to fill up our van. Today, all of our salt has disappeared from the stores (We have learned that two main cities that mine salt and export a lot of salt, have come under Russian occupation or are being targeted by missiles). Each day we face different struggles, but also see God's blessings as well. Through these difficulties, we see that God helps loosen our grasp that we have for this world. We should not try to hold on to this world, but long for Him. We are thankful to Him as it helps turn our eyes to Him, the author and perfecter of our faith. We definitely see that there is not much time before our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ returns for His Church! Evil is increasing, but at the same time, there are many who are wise and shining brightly like the heavens, and leading many to righteousness, just like it says in the book of Daniel.

We hear so many stories of God's goodness! A brother from our church that was drafted since the beginning of the war, is serving in the army and witnessing to many. (Even though he is a pacifist, and against carrying

weapons, he is using this time to serve God). The men that he serves with in the army always ask him to pray, and they all agree that it is because of God answering these prayers, that they are still alive today. We are witnessing God answering prayer!

One morning, one refugee brother witnessed a miracle and shared it with us in the prayer meeting. Anton had talked to a Christian brother that morning, who was trying to leave the Russian occupied town that he was living in. This Christian brother and his family had to go through 13 Russian check points before getting to Ukrainian territory. Each checkpoint lasted at least 2 hours. At the final checkpoint, the Russians did not want to let the brother and his family through. They even talked about shooting them. This brother was constantly praying for safe passage through the checkpoints. Suddenly, for no reason, the Russian soldiers started arguing among themselves, fighting and hitting each other. This Christian brother quickly started his car, and drove through the checkpoint. What a miracle! I don't think there has ever been so many prayers being said in Ukraine as there are now. I often hear of many people testifying to God's gracious hands!

Please continue to pray for New Life Church here and the entire country of Ukraine. Please pray that God's will is done and that many more people will be saved. We are praying for a revival that will go throughout the entire world! Come, Lord Jesus! Come!
